Projects can be small or large scale, and we would be interested to hear about ideas in early development as well as completed interventions and projects.

Whether you're an architect, designer, planner, public health professional, artist, citizen, community group, or work within the healthcare system itself we'd love to hear from you!

#### **Category questions:**

1. What stage of development is your intervention?  
Stage 1 - Idea only  
Stage 2 - In progress (including those that have moved beyond an idea and into a project planning phase)  
Stage 3 - Completed
2. What sector and profession do you work in?
3. Where is your intervention and what geographical area does it impact?
4. Has there been any collaborative working with other partners? Please tell us about this.
5. Describe to us what the idea/intervention/project is.....
6. How does/would the intervention support health and wellbeing of citizens?
7. What went well and what would you describe as your successes?
8. What are/have been the challenges so far? If anything has not gone to plan, how have you solved problems?
9. If at stage 2 or 3, what evaluation has been carried out, or is planned? Please include results of any evaluations if available, including citizen feedback.
10. If you could be granted a wishlist for the project/intervention – what would be on it?
11. In terms of legacy and sharing knowledge and learning what are your thoughts on this? Are there any actions you'd like to take?
12. Please provide a lead contact name for us to chat to if needed.
