Category: Innovation in Clinical Education

This category is open to organisations in the North East and North Cumbria

The category is open to individuals, teams or organisations that provide innovative teaching and learning methods, including the development of devices, platforms, solutions and initiatives that raise education quality, in any health and social care setting, for any clinical learner.

This category is for any group of clinical learners regardless of which setting they work or are employed in.

This category is not open to those who have been funded from or are employed by HEE (NE) in any capacity or is a HEENE or an HEE national initiative.

Please ensure that you have developed your submission with all who were involved with the project, and appropriate credit is given.

The category is sponsored by Health Education England North East (HEENE)

The entry criteria for **Innovation in Clinical Education** are:

The Idea

1. Describe the unmet need or problem your educational intervention addresses
2. Describe your solution/education programme and how it works
3. What is the benefit of the idea over current methods or products used?

Evidence

5. What has the evaluation of your educational intervention shown?
6. Are you aware of any companies/organisations who offer similar products or services?
7. What has been the impact on patients or learners?

Development

8. Did you research best educational practice before you commenced the project?
9. Has your idea been discussed with others?
10. Describe any challenges that may need to be overcome to further develop and/or implement your educational intervention?
11. Have any other people or organisations been involved with your idea?
 - i. If so, who and how?
12. Are you aware of anyone conducting research or trying to solve the same problem?
 - i. If so, who?
13. Should this idea go further, would you be prepared to invest time in its development?

Adoption and Sharing

14. Whilst innovation is undoubtedly important its value is strengthened by its ultimate adoption. How would you drive the adoption of your educational programme?
15. What structures are you aware of that could help you?

Entries will be assessed on the following:

Innovation: originality of the idea

Value: impact of the initiative on learners/patient care and/or service effectiveness

Learner Focus: How does this help learners in the clinical environment?

Patient focus: evidence that patient/service user need was considered

Collaboration: evidence of the involvement of other learners, professionals, services and/or patients in the project

Clinical effectiveness: data demonstrating how this initiative drives clinical enhancements

Leadership: evidence of entrants championing their innovation in their organisation or educational system

Adaptability: ideas that could be adapted for use elsewhere in the wider health and social care system

Sustainability: Aligns with the NHSE Green Plan

Deliverability: initiatives that can be embedded within organisations to operate without the input of the people who developed them
